# **ALERT LANDSLIDES**



## Colombia

San Salvador, 18 November 2020

## SITUATION

During the night of Friday the 13 November 2020, the town of DabeibaViejo in Colombia , was affected by High Precipitations that caused a great landslide in Dabeiba, western Antioquia. The emergency has so far left six dead and 16 missing persons, as confirmed by the National Unit for Risk Management, UNGR. The evacuation of the nearly 600 families in the affected zone was one of the actions prioritized by the authorities, the precipitations are forecast to continue for the next 10 days in the area..

#### **NEEDS**

The landslide has put the town in a state of crisis. The landslide affected persons find themselves in a desperate situation, with many unmet vital humanitarian needs such as access to: Sanitation and hygiene infrastructure, protection services, livehood activities, safe shelter

The dire situation is further compounded for the landslide affected people with vulnerabilities.; (optional) more specifically for woman and girls most vulnerable population type. There is a pressing necessity to provide immediate assistance to minimize loss of life and to ensure that the needs of the most vulnerable are covered first.

×	ACT Alliance is monitoring the situation and emergency teams are ready/preparing to
	respond according to the results of a contextual analysis and rapid needs assessment.
×	In collaboration with relevant stakeholders, the ACT forum has identified a gap in Sanitation
	, psychosocial support, livelihood activities and has resolved that if funded, it will have
	the capacity to properly bridge the identified gap.
×	The ACT forum is planning on submitting a funding proposal to provide livehood facilities
	, sanitation, psychosocial support to ensure that the landslide affected persons' basic
	needs are met with regards to Wash, Health, Shelter.
×	ACT Alliance is ready to respond, providing Hygiene Kits, psychosocial support, cash to
	600 affected persons in the coming months.
×	Furthermore, ACT Alliance will engage in advocacy on the national and international level
	to ensure that the voices of those affected by the landslide are amplified.
