Strategic Objective	To provide crisis-affected communities in Ukraine with life-saving multi-sectoral emergency support, while enabling the sustainable restoration and strengthening of basic services and resilience-building
Outcome 1	Crisis-affected communities in Ukraine have access to principled, multi-sectoral life-saving assistance to the most vulnerable internally displaced people and non-displaced people affected by the war, ensuring their safety and dignity, especially in areas experiencing high severity levels of need
Output 1.1	Ensure immediate access to life-saving emergency food assistance for food-insecure people
Output 1.2	Provide life-saving emergency shelter and non-food item (NFI) support to internally displaced and non-displaced war-affected people, ensuring their safety and dignity with a focus on areas with high severity level
Output 1.3	Ensure access to adequate housing and common services for internally displaced and non-displaced war-affected people, ensuring their protection, safety and dignity and fostering
